Here's the English version of the *bad news* on August 28, 2020: ***Peru Now World's Deadliest Covid Hot Spot***

(Bloomberg) -- Peru has set another grim record by reporting the highest number of deaths per capita from the coronavirus. With 28,277 confirmed deaths from Covid-19, or 86.2 per 100,000 inhabitants, Peru on Thursday overtook Belgium as the nation with the most victims, according to data compiled by Johns Hopkins University, the IMF and Bloomberg. It comes a week after the South American nation of 33 million posted the world's deepest economic contraction in the second quarter following a drastic lockdown....

It's also among nations with most fatalities by population size over the past week. Despite locking the entire country down
