Will you pray that the items they need to set up house and do ministry in Togo will be gathered soon so that we can help them pack a container? This morning as we were leaving Quincy to drive to St. Louis it was 19 degrees. There was no snow but everything was covered in ice. We are thankful for a safe drive to the airport and we are looking forward to being back in warm, sunny Florida!

Our daughter Amy, husband Joseph Marshall and 4 boys arrived in Sebring a few weeks ago. We have enjoyed having both of our children and families together in the same town for a bit. It has been fun for our 7 grandchildren to spend time with their cousins. They will be returning to Benin in the next few months. In the meantime, we are very thankful for the family time.

On the 14th of December we will be flying to Virginia. We will be visiting some old friends, making some new friends and visiting one of our MK's. Please pray for safety as we fly, for continued good health and that we will be an encouragement to all we come in contact with. Pray that we will represent Faith Baptist Mission and most importantly Jesus Christ well!

We want to thank you for praying for Chris's health. He has continued to have nausea and stomach pain with no clear answers. One of his doctor's said he thought Chris might have an ulcer and he wanted to schedule an endoscopy and colonoscopy. When they consulted with the cardiologist and the doctor who did the stent, they said that Chris could not come off the blood thinners at this time. They said that the earliest he could have those procedures would be February. In light of that, his doctor decided to go ahead and put him on the medicine to treat an ulcer.
